School Update:

- 1) **ACES Idol** was on May 9th. Thanks to Mme. Maloney, and Ms.Rhine for spearheading the event. Several teachers partnered with them to hold auditions and help with setup.
- 2) **Kinder Collection Fair** was on May 8th. Families were invited to see the variety of collections made by our kinder kids. There was a great turnout.
- 3) **Grade 6 Freezie Sales:** (May 10, May 17, June 6 and June 14). Fundraising is for the grade 6 end of the year field trip to Bonnenfant Camp in Dunrobin. Freezies are \$1 each and are nut free and gluten free.
- 4) **Lead Like a Girl Conference:** Mme Perrault took 13 grade 6 girls to Elmwood School on April 30th. It was an opportunity to join girls from across Ottawa to hear inspirational stories from Sophie Gregoire Trudeau and other prominent women in how to dream big dreams and lead with confidence.





- 5) **Grade 4 EFI:** This class had a rocks and minerals fashion show to show their learning last week. They are also working with the GLP class to help them with learning to play the ukuleles that are currently borrowed from the OCDSB.
- 6) **Scientist in Schools Math Addition!** Mrs Radbourne has organized a math workshop called Fractions in Action for MF4A and MF45A (Mariano and Lemieux) on May 15th.
- 7) **Mock Trials MF4A and MF45A:** Mrs. Radbourne is also partnering with The Elementary School Mock Trials (ESMT) which is a free program offered by the Ontario Bar Association (OBA).

On Day 1, the lawyer(s)-volunteer attends the classroom and provides students with an overview of the Canadian Criminal Justice System, introduce the fact scenario for the mock trial, and 'walk through' the various roles and duties of participants in a Court (jurors, witnesses and lawyers, both Prosecution (Crown) and Defence).

After Day 1, the lawyers re-attend the classroom to preside over the trial. In classes where there are two (or more) lawyer-volunteers, one can preside as judge while the other lawyer acts an "advisor" in the event the various participants need some gentle direction during the mock trial, including assistance with jury deliberations.

- 8) **Field Trip Frenzie!** Classes are travelling to the Canadian Museum of Agriculture, the Mill of Kintail, the Museum of History and to Stonecrest Water park. Our Council funded buses are being put to good use and staff appreciate the ability to enhance their programs.
- 9) **Butterfly Garden Maintenance:** Our community coordinator for the butterfly garden, Clare, has created a poster that can be used to invite more help with maintenance of the space. She is wondering if Council could electronically attach it to their platform(s). What Clare does is create a calendar from about mid-May to mid-September, and families (or individuals) sign-up for a couple of weeks over the summer. If the week they chose is rainy, then there is nothing to do; if sunny, then they water, depending on how hot/dry it is, possibly daily. The portable hose and trolley are provided.
