Furthermore, ACES School Council is pleased to report having been selected as one of the successful OCDSB recipients of a Parents Reaching Out (PRO) Grant in the 2018 - 2019 school year, funding which was applied to secure the following two parent workshops:

In addition to coordinating the various fundraising events our school community has come to expect over the years, ACES Council also endeavoured in the following behind-the-scenes initiatives, which were largely centred on adopting more effective communication strategies:

- The development of a solid online presence through the construction of a school council website designed to be a reference point for the community and council members alike
- The creation of an ACES School Council Facebook Page to serve as hub of timely reminders and updates related to ongoing and/or upcoming council activities.

Council's other initiatives included the implementation of procedures aimed to promote sustainability of council programs from one year to the next, facilitating the transfer of knowledge to future councils:

- The devising of orientation packages for new council members
- Compiling an accessible repository of "how to..." guides outlining the basics of planning events

Council also advised Principal Simpson and Vice Principal Christie on the selection of a school photographer in keeping with criteria that would appeal to families school-wide (picture quality, customizable backgrounds and poses, quick turnaround time, availability of sibling photos, etc), while remaining cognisant the final decision was ultimately theirs.

Over the course of the 2018 - 2019 school year, ACES School Council held ten meetings: (September 17th, October 15th, November 12th, December 10th, January 14th, February 11th, March 4th, April 8th, May 12th, and June 10th). These meetings were open to the public to encourage input from parents and other members of the school community.
